Minutes of the RDA Meeting Thursday, September 16, 2021 Held at CAOC Presbyterian Church 5951 College Ave & online via Zoom

President Stephanie Watson opened the meeting, recognizing a quorum at 8:38am.

- I. The board approved the agenda by consent.
- II. The board approved the Minutes w Addendum- Emailed Marketing Report 8-19-2021 by consent.
- III. Chair's report

a. Stephanie shared some updates about the recent Rock & Stroll Event.

- IV. Treasurer's Report (Disbursement Schedule 4/30 | 7/31 | 10/31)
 - a. Susan reported that we have \$111,000 in our account and shouldn't expect to receive any more from the city. We will be sustained until our first check in April 2022. We'll need to be wise with our monies. Our budget next year will not likely be much better.
 - b. Mikah Hinkle is the new person in the city office and confirmed the chaos there. Susan has confidence that he'll get things in order and hopes he'll be good to work with.
- V. Streetscape and Security:
 - a. Chris updated the board on a new unhoused trouble-maker along the avenue, the removal of the driveway at the former Shell site, and the city of Berkeley removing the belongings of John who hangs in front of La Farine (which might move him along). The Oakland resident who is suing local businesses owners for non ADA compliance is continuing this movement.
 - b. Unsheltered (Running Agenda Discussion). Monte is trying to connect with organizers via Faith in Action to identify some potential de-escalation training for merchants and residents in conflictual encounters with the unhoused in our district.
 - c. Street Cleaning as of 9/1/2021 1 day per week
 - d. Tree report. See the minutes from the last meeting (August 2021). Susan is talking with the Rockrdige resident who has strong feelings about trees and hopes that this conversation will reduce the pressure from this resident for unaffordable action when they get the whole picture. The arborist we've worked with has offered to put up a tree for free in front of the library at the end of 2021.
- VI. Marketing and Promotions:

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- a. Rock & Stroll– Jody Colley reported a successful September Event. Attendance increased over the previous month. Those who do online promotions demonstrably get more business and clients. The only complaint was regarding the lack of programming at 9-10am. The budget was \$5,000. There were 2,500 unique web visitors the week of the event. Most of these came directly through our URL as opposed to via social media sites and posts. This demonstrates a wide penetration of our past marketing efforts in the population who "knows" our URL. See Jody's full report for more information and details (attached).
- b. Out & About 2022- Report out by Katy / The Survey seeking to see the general interest in an Out and About Event in 2022 has not produced significant results. We'll relaunch it and use that information in making a recommendation/decision about whether we attempt and Out & About style large event in March 2022 or September 2022. Following discussion an apparent consensus solidified around the likelihood more of doing such an event in September 2022 and the need and strong desire for us to create more pop-up table spaces for community engagement at the next Rock & Stroll as a way to help smaller businesses connect with clients. Suggestions were made to have several foci points along the avenue, not just at the BART plaza, where this might happen. This seemed to be a potential avenue for action that would cost less money, require less approval from the city and potentially be very organic and community-grown. 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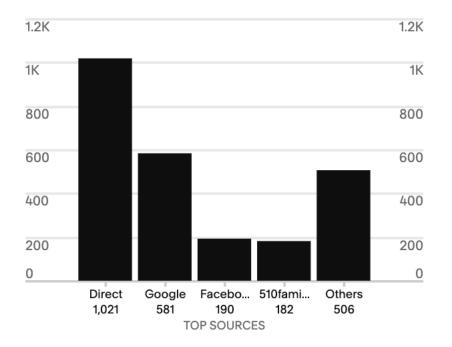
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1. Another successful Sept. 11 Rock-N-Stroll:

Issues or concerns: Overlapping music and trivia game at Golden Squirrel, but otherwise no reported problems. Attendance seemed stronger than last month. Pointing Rockridge BART station music in a northerly direction reduced noise for Market Hall office tenants. No known issues with City, Police, or BART. One attendee complained on social media that nothing was happening, but they went out between 9am-10am. One band reported that another band pulled the plug on them with 8 minutes left in their set — maybe accidently. Chris may have more street-level observations to add.

Media note: Oaklandside covered our event. Popular family website <u>510Families.com</u> covered our event and kids' activities as their event pick of the week.

Marketing reach: We <u>saw 2480 unique visitors</u> to the website the <u>week of the event</u>. Most people came directly to the website by typing in our URL--likely seeing the website on posters, Rockridge News display ad, or just knowing it. Google search was next highest. Third was 510Families (with good showings also from SF Funcheap, Visit Oakland, Ronnie's Awesome List, and BARTable). Third most segment of visitors came from Facebook (190 people) with Instagram bringing us (104) people. All other sources were individually nominal.

Budget: The event cost the RDA \$4811 (\$3600 performers + \$656 advertising + \$55 sound permit + \$500 for the fashion show, subsidized by Keep Oakland Alive).
